Beyond Borders Totnes & District is a volunteer-led network that lends support to asylum seekers and refugees. We collaborate with official refugee support organisations and:




- help to coordinate outings to local farms, retreat centres and other places



Our purpose is:

- to empower individuals, families, and communities to access the skills, employment, housing, education, leisure pursuits, and well-being to which they are entitled
- to provide statutory and other mainstream services with good quality local information through the provision of bespoke consultation events and other forms of data capture
- to promote good relations between minority ethnic and mainstream white British residents

Since 2005, Hikmat has been developing several strands of service provision and currently delivers around 2000 in-person sessions annually through:





While most of these classes do not lead to a qualification, community ESOL classes are usually taught by well-qualified and experienced teachers. 

The Devon and Cornwall Police Diverse Communities Team (DCT) is a small team of specialist officers and staff who focus on maintaining and developing confidence in the police, working to ensure community cohesion. It supports local officers in understanding the needs of people with protected characteristics and ensuring that we work with our diverse communities to protect the vulnerable and reduce the risk of harm.

We work to achieve the following aims:

- increase awareness and reporting of hate crime
- reduce the re-victimisation of hate crime victims
